Being a Democratic Activist is an Ongoing Pursuit: Please Join Us, Because So Much is at Stake

Reading the newspapers over the last few weeks, it is easy to see that the vision of our Democratic leaders and the passion of our Democratic grassroots are needed now more than ever. The work doesn't stop after a presidential election. Fortunately, the 46th District Democrats are engaged in tracking issues and campaigns each year. We are about doing the hard work necessary to move the progressive agenda forward! And it's not just one issue, but many...

The strength and integrity of our Democratic leaders in Congress are needed on issues such as the War in Iraq and *protecting* (not reforming) Social Security. The wholesale rewrite by Republicans of Senate rules to effectively erase the opportunity to filibuster on issues of extreme importance will allow for a tyranny of the majority. Democratic voices must be heard. We can't let the "politics of distraction" allow the Republicans to pass their agenda when no one is paying attention. Senators Murray and Cantwell, and Representative McDermott need to hear from us to know that the Democratic grassroots back here in Washington support them in their efforts to hold the line against the right-wing agenda.

Closer to home, the strength of our Democratic Party is needed to give confidence to Democratic legislators from across the state to adopt a budget that will fully fund education, pay State employees a fair wage and invest wisely in our public infrastructure. Democratic voices are needed to defend Governor Gregoire and King County Executive Sims from attacks that are based on right-wing political agendas. Let Democrats shout out the *facts* about elections and ensure that the people are fairly represented.

Looking into the future, Democrats must engage all citizens

in a dialogue that results in both an exchange of ideas and an education on the issues. Democrats have a responsibility and a tradition of being the Party that both listens to the citizenry *and* helps them understand what is at stake. One example is the need for Democrats and labor organizations to stop the forthcoming initiative to make Washington a "Right to Work" state, effectively eliminating many of the protections on the wages and working conditions of our workers. Another example is the need for Democrats and grassroots environmental organizations to stop a property rights "takings" initiative in Washington State that will cost tax payers millions and destroy our natural areas forever. Or pick another issue: health care, transportation, education, world diplomacy... the list goes on and on. Democrats are needed now more than ever.

What does this mean for you?

Presumably, you are a Democrat because you believe in the Democratic platform. Maybe you support only part of it, but you are passionate about your issues. For you, these issues define fairness, justice, good health, peace and a better future. These are the values by which you live your life. In Case You Missed It... Life in the Fabulous 46th!

The March 17th meeting was filled with three guest speakers, committee reports and several announcements. Here are some of the highlights.

There is a big change coming in the way the Democratic Party will select our candidates for the November 2005 ballot. The Party will use a nomination convention to select candidates for office. The races for King County offices (Council and Executive) are the only partisan offices up for election in 2005. The nomination process is still being clarified, but we for more information in the next month. If you are a PCO, be ready for some action! Speaking of PCO's, we'd like to welcome **Christopher Robinson** (pct 1303) and **Barbara Pistoresi** (pct 1292)! And our area coordinator program is starting to fill up. We're really looking forward to a good year, and we're going to be ready for 2006.

We approved our 2005 budget. Thanks to **Gail Chiarello** for the tremendous amount of work that she has done to convert the books to Quickbooks and take ownership of our finances. We're a much stronger district with such a dedicated Treasurer.

We are looking for people who are involved in their community groups around North Seattle. We want to know what groups are out there, and how we can make a connection. Let's bring the Democratic Party back into people's minds as a place to come when looking for solutions, not just another meeting to go to every month! We'd love you to be the eyes and ears of the 46th in your group. We want this communication to be two-way, so we hope you'll let us know how the 46th Dems can help your group. Our program director, Gerry Pollet, identified some key issues for City Council Members and candidates to talk to from our February Issue and Platform Workshop. All speakers were asked to address these identified relevant issues up front.

Jan Drago, President of the Seattle City Council, spoke about the Northgate development plan, the monorail, the viaduct replacement, sound transit and a host of other issues that they are working on in City Hall. She remembered George Benson, the father of the Waterfront Streetcar, and she is working on a memorial for him.

Jan is also a candidate this year, and reviewed her history as a Democratic activist, including her recent work for John Kerry. Her goals include developing a biotech industry cluster in South Lake Union. Public Transit and an integrated city and county transportation system also need support. She

believes that the 520 bridge widening project must also be integrated into an overall transportation plan. She is focused on affordable housing, which is required to support future growth in our city population.

Craig Mason, a former (and future?) candidate for congress in the 4th Congressional District vs. Doc Hastings, spoke to the crowd on how to bridge the "values gap" between Eastern and Western Washington. He is a self-described "class warrior" and has been reframing messages to appeal to Democratic values in all regions of the state. Big issues in his area are gun rights, abortion and gay marriage. We can tie these together by arguing that a government that regulates marriage and abortion would also regulate guns. Craig says Democrats stand for the wise use of government - support of New Deal programs and opportunity for every citizen. King County Councilman Dwight Pelz spoke to the crowd about the importance of how mass transit, affordable housing and urban environmentalism are key to shaping a healthy and prosperous region. As Chair of the Council's Transportation Committee and a member of the Sound Transit Board, he presented his vision for an integrated and efficient regional transportation system that is rooted in progressive values, including *more* mass transit.

Dwight is running for Seattle City Council this year. He has many early endorsements and 30 years of grassroots activism in Seattle. Citizens in Washington don't pay sales tax on food items anymore because of Dwight's first initiative many years ago. Dwight noted, "the public will see that taxes invested in infrastructure make a better outcome than tax breaks for the rich." For more information go to: www.dwightpelz.com

4. Bring Home the National Guard Troops

Whereas, the conditions underlying the authorization for use of US Military Force against Iraq have been proven false or declared invalid, and

Whereas, the number of deaths of National Guard members continues to increase and whereas the National Guard is for the protection of the sovereignty of US borders, and

Whereas, under the heading Foreign Policy of the 46th Legislative District's platform, item 2 states "We call on the U.S. government to retire the "doctrine" of preemptive war"; and

Whereas, the Governor of the state, by virtues of the office, is the peacetime Commander-In Chief of the militia and may issue lawful regulations of its governance; and

Whereas, absent the formal Declaration of War, the President cannot call the National Guard without the Governor's compliance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the 46th District Democrats call on the Governor to bring the National Guard troops home at once.

5. Opposing King County Initiative 22 (I-22)

WHEREAS King County I-22 will amend the King County Charter by changing the elected offices of the Executive, Council and Assessor from partisan to nonpartisan, and

WHEREAS I-22 is sponsored by the Citizens' Alliance for Property Rights, and

WHEREAS the citizens of King County constitute a diverse populace with differing needs and priorities for their county government, as well as differing political philosophies, and

WHEREAS local grassroots Party organizations are deeply connected to the neighborhoods they represent and the values of their communities, and

WHEREAS most of the issues, policies and services managed and provided by King County government are addressed directly or indirectly in the Democrat and Republican Party Platforms, including but not limited to: transportation, economic and social justice, environmental protection, growth management, civil rights, labor, law and justice, taxation and human services, and

WHEREAS party affiliation plays a critical role in educating voters by serving as the primary indicator of a candidate's political philosophy and likely policy agenda, and

WHEREAS eliminating partisan offices for King County will consolidate too much influence and power over the outcome of elections with the media, particularly the daily newspapers, as they would then become an unfiltered source for providing unchecked information about the policy positions and qualifications of candidates and elected officials, and

WHEREAS local grassroots Party organizations, both Dem & Rep, are uniquely positioned to: 1) educate and communicate directly with their neighbors and other members in their community on county governance matters, 2) hold candidates and elected officials accountable for the policies they support and the decisions they make, 3) work directly with their neighbors and other members in their community to ensure transparent, accessible, accountable and effective county government;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the 46th District Democrats that we oppose King County Initiative 22 and encourage all citizens, community organizations, businesses, candidates for partisan office and other groups who are interested in transparent, accessible, accountable and effective county government to publicly oppose I-22.

Proposed Revised Bylaws

up for Consideration and Action on April 21st

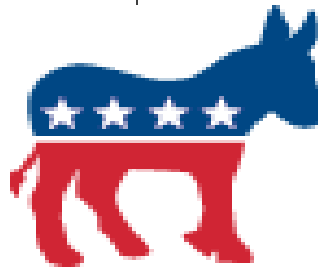
The Bylaws of the 46th District Democrats date back to 1985 and were last amended in April 2003. A number of accumulating circumstances, including some arising even in the last two years, have required that they be updated again. Accordingly, Scott appointed a committee to perform the necessary review and propose changes, while considering further suggestions from the membership at large. The Bylaws Committee met frequently over a period of several weeks, working through several drafts, and presented its final recommended changes to the District's Executive Board on April 5. By the time you read this, Bylaws reflecting all revisions approved by the Board – for adoption by the general membership at our April 21 meeting – will be available on the “46dems” website.

Perhaps the most obvious changes are in the nature of housekeeping: simplification and clarification throughout, to make the Bylaws more readable and readily understandable by all, as well as easier to work with. We eliminated many unnecessary words and phrases, including several found to be duplicative of matters set forth elsewhere in the Bylaws, as well as the rather pompous, legalistic repetition of numbers in both words and digits. We also (a) clarified several complex sentences by dividing their serial phrases through insertion of bracketed letters, such as in this sentence, (b) defined the responsibilities of our standing committees, including two new ones, and (c) made explicit certain aspects of current District practice.

But our recommended product also includes some significant substantive changes – mostly to provide for more openness and participatory opportunities for our general membership, or to conform to requirements imposed on us “from above,” or to update in other needed respects. One of the latter can be seen in Art. IV, Sec. 6 (formerly Sec. 5), where, in recognition of our larger membership, we increased the District-meeting quorum requirement from 25 signed-in voting members to either 40 such members or 10% of all our voting members, whichever is less. (As of April 5, we had 391 members.)

The role of our Treasurer, whose operations on

our behalf are subject to strict regulation by the state's Public Disclosure Commission, occasioned a number of amendments, mostly in Article XIII -- whose unworkably low dollar thresholds were given a long overdue updating. A key change to Art. XIII recognizes that our annual adoption of a budget serves as authorization for expenditures provided for in that budget. Further, in recognition of the difficulty of convening a qualified 3-person audit committee immediately after our biennial



reorganization, and of expecting their report early in the calendar year, we relaxed some secondary aspects of our audit provision (Art. XIII, Sec. 3). Finally, because the PDC insists that all responsibility for financial matters must rest in the office of the Treasurer, including his/her deputies, we amplified the job descriptions of the Chair and 1st Vice Chair – alternate signers of our largest checks – to make them deputy treasurers. (See Art. XIII, Sec. 2, and Art. V, Sec. 4 & 5).

Another modification in response to a change “from above” narrows the definition of candidates eligible for endorsement by the 46th District. The State Democratic Party, in implementing its rejection of the idea of simultaneous membership in two parties (e.g., Dems and Greens), recently adopted a Democrat-only provision that we felt required to emulate in amending our Art. XVI, Sec. 7.

This effort to “clean up” our Bylaws has been consuming of both energy and time, on the part of the Bylaws Committee as well as your E-Board. We hope you will find it a clearcut improvement worthy of your approval on April 21.

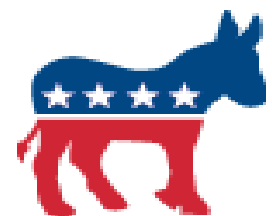

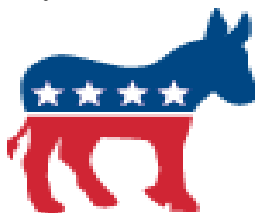
