King County Convention

Democrats gathered on Sunday April 13, 2008 for the King County Convention at the West Seattle High School Gymnasium. Keynoting the event was the Honorable Governor of the State of Washington, Christine Gregoire. Other speakers included Congressmen Jay Inslee—1st District, Jim McDermott—7th District, and Adam Smith—9th District; Candidate for the 8th District, Darcy Burner; King County Executive Ron Sims. Superintendent of Schools Terry Bergeson addressed the group and Insurance Commissioner Mike Kriedler, along with Candidates Jim McIntire (State Treasurer), Peter Goldmark (Lands Commissioner), and John Ladenburg (Attorney General), were introduced.

Co-Chairing the convention were Senator Margarita Prentice (11th) and Representative Phyllis Gutierrez Kenney (46th); Elva Gonzalez served as secretary, Alec Stephens as parliamentarian, Ivan Weiss as sergeant-at-arms, and Aaron Belenky as the timekeeper. Chuck Laney was in charge of the tally committee. Gurine Nordby chaired the credentials committee and had over 70 volunteers registering delegates and alternates. A total of 911 delegates were seated. Barbara Whitt was the leader at the refreshments stand and Linnea Peterson did the door prizes with help from Azziem Underwood.

Chair of the Platform/Resolutions Committee, Joel Ware, conducted the discussion on platform issues and the top ten resolutions. The committee is shown below — a very happy group after the adoption of the 2008 platform (will be available soon at the KCDCC website).

**King County Democratic Central Committee
Meeting Minutes of March 25, 2008**

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 followed by the flag salute and approval of previous meeting minutes. The proposed agenda was amended to bring David McDonald to the microphone upon his arrival; amended agenda was approved.

Introductions and Announcements:

John Spady presented the Volunteer Citizens Councilors program for King County, promoted by Dick's Drive-in (Spady family) at no cost to the public. They need 1,000 persons interested in discussing transportation to get started, perhaps in May.

Speakers:

Judge Monica Benton is running again for Superior Court. She is rated exceptionally well qualified.

Judge Mariane Spearman, King County District Court judge, is running for an open seat, Pos. 53.

Regina Cahan is running for an open seat in King County Superior Court. She is a judge pro tem. She worked in the KC Prosecuting Attorney's office. She is rated exceptionally well qualified by the King County Bar Association. In addition to her J.D., she has a Masters in Social Work, which adds a different perspective.

Sue Pariesian is running for Pos. 1, a vacant seat. She is an Assistant Attorney General since 1998, and was previously with the insurance industry and Nordstrom. She took a leave to provide legal work for Gov. Gregoire's campaign and for the recount. She is rated exceptionally well qualified and well qualified by different rating groups.

Commissioner Lloyd Hara, Port of Seattle received a framed plaque of Pioneer Square. The Port is three years away from its centennial. He noted two new airlines serving SeaTac and two international airlines are coming in time for summer. Virgin America started service last week, including direct service via Northwest AL to Heathrow. We are the 3rd largest logistic center in the U.S. the Port represents over 200,000 jobs, directly or indirectly. Lloyd is working about 60 hours a week working on the state audit. There is a definite change at the top, changing the culture of the Port. Contracting is more fair. They created a new Department of Social Responsibility to contract with women and minority-owned businesses. No more hanky-panky or heads will roll. Kurt Beckett is the new Director of Community Affairs. The State had over 28 bills regarding the Port; it passed a few, especially changing the contracting rules. We no longer bank property tax millage (against future rate increases). We are trying to make the Port more efficient and drive down costs. Light rail will reach the airport at 2009. Station costs have come in higher than anticipated.

John Ladenburg, Pierce County Executive for seven years, is running for WA State Attorney General to replace Rob McKenna. Was chair of Sound Transit Board for two terms. He was previously the prosecuting attorney and on Tacoma City Council. Grew up in a union family with 16 children. Dad said, "Never vote Republican; never cross a picket line." Worked his way through law school in IBEW union job. Practiced law for 10 years and learned how important it is for average people to have a good lawyer. Fought to clean up Tacoma's drinking water. Tacoma is building a methane conversion to natural gas system at its landfill and will run its trucks on the natural gas. (He's very progressive, a member of the National Organization of Women since 1972.)

Says the Supreme Court is undoubtedly planning on reversing Roe v. Wade. While privacy is not in the U.S. Constitution per se, it is explicitly in our state constitution, so we have a higher standard. He believes our Attorney General will likely be in the position of defending our state right to choice against a federal suit. Pierce County was able to return \$1 million of surplus self-insurance funds to the general fund because he knows how to manage risk. Rob McKenna has declined to fight identity theft. He has been less than energetic in protecting consumers. Rob McKenna had doubled the political staff of the office, hiring two persons directly out of BIAW (business lobbyists). McKenna tried to destroy the WEA. His decisions seem purely political and self-serving. He favors public campaign financing, and we need to do something about soft money. The national Chamber of Commerce did a complete smear campaign on Debra Senn; that's how McKenna was elected. The C of C operatives should have gone to jail. We need a "corporate death penalty" for repeat corporate polluters, for example, so they would be sanctioned and disincorporated. Targeting the "dirty dozen" motivated the others to clean up or go to jail. We've cleaned up 10,000 junked cars in Pierce County and recycled them!

Scott White was introduced for 46th LD Rep and **Tina Shamseldin** for 33rd LD Rep. Both co-chaired the KC Legislative Action Committee and are stepping down. April 24th is Tina's campaign kickoff at Mick's Pub in Burien.

Chelsea Waliser spoke about the Washington State Democratic Coordinated Campaign and the neighborhood challenge. More to come — Chelsea will contact each LD chair.

David McDonald, DNC Rep and member of the Rules Committee was invited to address the KCDCC about the "top two primary." We have been fighting to replace the blanket primary for six or seven years. Declared unconstitutional in 2004, but the Grange promoted an initiative that tried to get around it, by stating "which party you prefer" on the ballot. It still may be unconstitutional, but we have to prove in practice that this method doesn't work. It will be a series of failed experiments with the primary

ballot, until the Legislature acts. Our injunction was the only thing ruled on. Elimination of minor parties and the campaign advertising statute are other issues. The statute requires them to reprint their party on their campaign literature. There will be no way to have bonafide viable third party candidates. How we redistrict is done by the two parties—how would we do this with persons who “think they might be Democrats?” PCOs are listed on the primary ballots and cannot be voted on by Republicans and Independents, on an all-mail ballot. PCOs are entrusted to elect legislators when someone resigns. If they can’t do the PCO election, they will be enjoined. There are a number of problems. They are meeting with the Secretary of State tomorrow. There could be a special session to deal with it. What are we going to do this year? We didn’t expect to win in court in 2005, so we adopted rules to determine who could file as a Democrat. However, it apparently doesn’t matter if we do this before or after filing. We don’t know if we can do a coordinated campaign under federal election law. The safest thing is for us to create nominees; we don’t know timing or mechanism.
